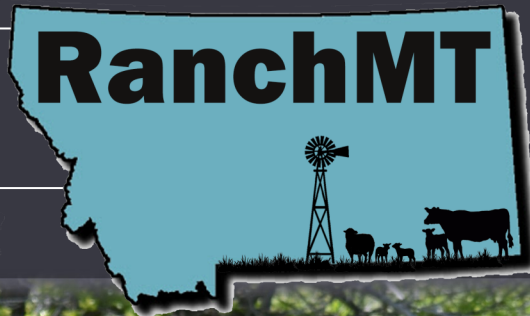

Project Update

I hope this newsletter finds you well—despite the droughty conditions we are all experiencing. As my time as the RanchMT Project Manager is coming to a close, I have found myself looking back at all the progress we have made in the last year, and while we have had a few set backs and lots of changes, it's pretty impressive how much we have accomplished! RanchMT started from one conversation and has since grown into a program where we have over 100 individuals supporting and helping get this program up and running. The support RanchMT has received has been amazing and we are truly grateful.

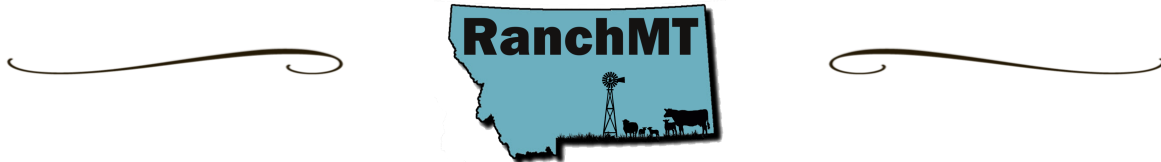
These last couple of months we have been busy developing our program timeline, implementation plan, writing grant reports, and planning future events. We also recently better defined the objectives for the RanchMT course. Check them out on page 5 of this newsletter!

The biggest news we have to share is that Winnett ACES will be hosting *Winnett ACES Rancher Resource Seminar Series* during the years that RanchMT is securing housing and funding. This seminar series will be a 2-year series in Winnett with the focus being on Winnett ACES members, but workshops/classes will be open to anyone who wants to attend! Winnett ACES's new Education and Outreach Coordinator will be in charge of coordinating and finalizing all details relating to these workshops and classes. Instructors for classes will be local and regional experts, NRCS personnel, and MSU Extension professionals. Class attendees will pay a small fee for each workshop that they attend. At the end of the two-year course of workshops, we hope to offer class participants the opportunity to join a weeklong out-of-state trip. This trip will either explore the post-weaning side of the cattle industry or provide participants the opportunity to gain an urbanized perspective of agriculture in a large city and meet with congressional representatives.

Winnett ACES is holding their All ACES meeting Monday, July 26, in Winnett. The guest for the month is the MSU Ranching Systems Team. The goals for this meeting is to: 1). provide an introduction of the RanchCasts Team Members and their various areas of expertise, 2). Introduce the concept of the Ranch Cats team approach and explore future opportunities to provide team-based education 3). Hear from ACES about their educational needs. This meeting is open to anyone and we encourage you to come. It is a potluck!

MSU Dan Scott Ranch Management Program, Winnett ACES, and RanchMT have been working together to host a Rancher Resource Network Educational Summit. This summit will be held Tuesday, August 17 at 9am at the Eagles Club in Lewistown. Proposed Implementation Timeline

Our steering committee has been busy working on the proposed timeline for the future of the RanchMT program. Here is our projected timeline moving forward.

August 16, 2021 – Final RanchMT Project Presentation to ACES and PCCD boards

August 17, 2021 – Final RanchMT Project Presentation to Project Partners during Rancher Resource Network Educational Summit

August 31, 2021 – Planning Gant concludes

September 2021-September 2022—ACES to plan and coordinate a 2-year Seminar Series

October 2022-October 2024 – ACES to run *Winnett ACES Rancher Resource Seminar Series*

October 2023 – Identify housing of the RanchMT program

March 2024 – Project Partner Letters of Intent due

2023 and 2024 – Apply for grant funding

September 2024 – Advertise RanchMT Coordinator position

November 2024 – Hire RanchMT Coordinator

January 2025 – Start advertising for class #1

January-October 2025 – Work on class logistics

September 2025—Applications due for class #1

October 2025 – Start class #1

October 2027 – Start class #2



Outcomes of the Class

"Providing beginning Montana ranchers with knowledge, resources and a professional network to help make decisions that further their ecological, economic, and social sustainability."

Understand the need for continuing agriculture education and develop a strategy to do this through other programs and resources.

Establish a strong support network in the cattle industry, and work to foster those friendships and business relationships.

Critically evaluate the current financial status of their operation and conduct an enterprise analysis with the goal of defining strategies to maximize sustainable profitability.

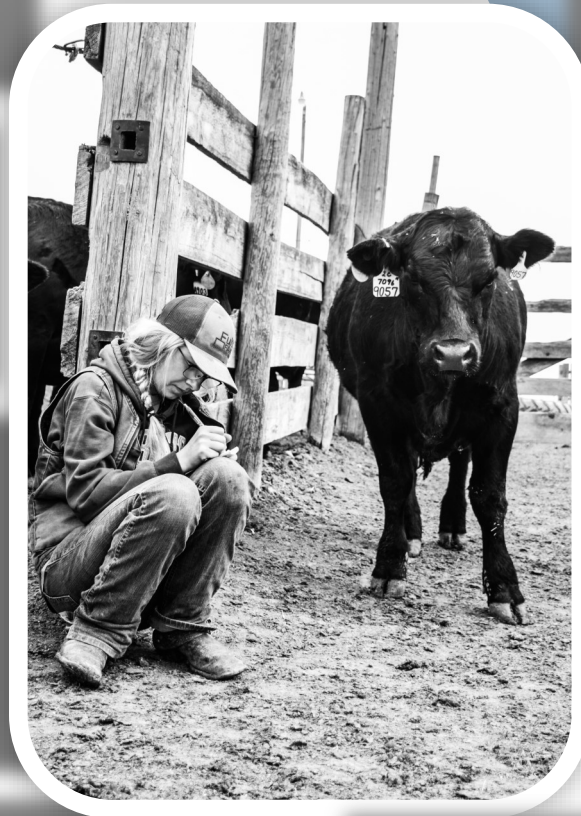
Design and implement a grazing and natural resource plan for their operation.

Comprehend the full spectrum of the cattle industry from gestation to consumption and describe the contributions of their operation to the industry or process.

Develop ranch goals, and create a marketing and business plan specific to their operation.

Recognize and evaluate ways to balance work, business, and relationships, to promote personal and family well-being.

Possess the knowledge and tools to develop a working transition plan to ensure younger generations have the opportunity to move back to the ranch.



Identify and evaluate options to increase flexibility and provide a cushion in volatile markets.

Demonstrate the necessary skills in leadership and volunteerism to be stronger contributors to their community and serve effectively on local, state and national boards that align with their skillset and interests.

Assemble and utilize a functioning off-ranch management team; including professionals in legal, accounting and financial planning, estate management, conservation and land management, and experts in livestock health and production.

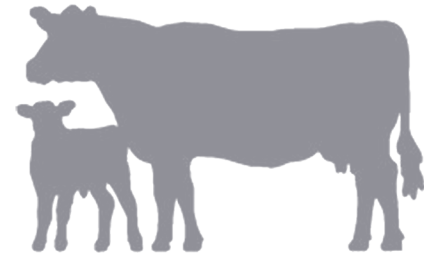
