

# BeefMT Update

BeefMT is looking for a long-term home for the program and Montana State University is looking like the perfect location. The Dan Scott Ranch Management Program (DSRMP), a relatively new program within the Department of Animal and Range Sciences at MSU, is charged with training the next generation of professional ranch managers through the Ranching Systems degree as well as developing an outreach program that serves MT's ranching community. This program is uniquely situated to bring together the different disciplines of ranching into a focused educational program for the entire state, and to leverage the resources and stability of MSU to ensure program longevity.

Rachel Frost, the DSRMP program lead has been working with MSU faculty and staff to create a full team to handle finances, class logistics, grant writing and reporting, and course content development. This team is still growing, but already includes Administrative and Accounting support, many of the MSU Extension Specialists in the Department of Animal and Range Sciences (RanchCats), along with teaching and research faculty. Conversations are ongoing with faculty in the Department of Agriculture Economics and Economics and from the Jake Jabs College of Business. Along with knowledge in their area of expertise, each of these team members brings a professional network of national scope to ensure that dynamic and informative speakers are recruited for each class. This team will meet regularly to develop the curriculum for the program based on needs within the state and the beef industry as a whole.

The goal is to apply for external funding for the BeefMT program in early 2022. If funds are secured, the next step is hiring a program coordinator and advertising for the initial class with the first class of BeefMT starting in the fall of 2023. There is still much work to be done, but initial conversations and planning indicate great potential for the program to find that permanent home at MSU.
