


## **Processing Survey Results**

2a. I would like to see a meat processing facility established in Petroleum County






## 3. How would you personally use a meat processing facility?

# of Animals:


- Custom Cut: ranged from 1-10 (someone answered 100s)

4a. Would you be comfortable with a meat processing facility on the outskirts of Winnett?




4b. Suggestions for Locations:

## 2b. Reasons for wanting/not wanting a processing facility:

- 8-12 months out for both of the butchers that I regularly use. That's too long. If we want food security in this country we need to be able to harvest what local ranchers are able to produce.
- Add value to our raised product.
- Alows for more local product options and brings some jobs to our community.
- Create opportunity to feed our own cattle
- Diversity of opportunities
- Expedite beef from country to table, local processors are busy
- Great for the ag community
- I believe a facility would be beneficial for producers as well as the community.
- I believe it would truly help this community in growth with employment, and having a local place to take meat to be processed would be nice.
- I believe there is a need, a market, and it would create jobs, and be more sustainable due to less driving/hauling livestock.
- I believe this is a missing component in all of Central MT. Currently folks are waiting up to 12 months to get beef and other livestock processed. A facility that could focus primarily on beef pork sheep and other livestock would benefit all producers and would possibly open up other options for selling and marketing custom production needs.
- I see the demand for locally grown and processed meat increasing. There is quite a waiting period to get meat processed at Ryan's processing plant. The time is right with grass finished beef becoming popular and common, also.
- I think it is critical to rural livelihoods to bring good jobs, create opportunity for local ranchers and create new opportunities for my children to come home.
- I wonder if it is feasible to build a facility in such a low population county. Where would the workforce come from? Generally speaking, however, Montana NEEDS more processing capacity so I would support most any project that was economical.
- I would need to see more information. While I am interested in bringing commerce to Petroleum County, I would like to see how it will effect businesses already in Petroleum County. I would like to see how it will effect jobs and the school.
- Increase of tax base.
- it would be a real boon to the community and provide a local important service that current residents have to go out of County to utilize

- The local ag people need someplace close to process their meat. It would be great if the plan was to sell meat to the general public. You should also know why previous processing plants have closed.
- The more meat procressing sites the better. Keeps the option of local beef more local. Keeps Montana ag industries alive. Keeps prices competitive. Keeps people employed. Yes all around!
- The more we can have our beef processed locally the better!
- There is only one processing plant in Judith Basin that we use but the capacity is exceeded by the number of people that want to use it. Also the colony doesn't always follow the directions provided for cuts and packaging. The next closest facility is Belt, MT and it is also too busy. It is within driving distance to Petroleum if space was available.
- This would be good for everyone involved. Lets bring more businesses and jobs to Petroleum County!
- We happily drive our beef to Lewistown to be processed but if there was a more local facility in Winnett we would surely support them. We supported Olson's and the Grass Range store when they were still cutting meat.

With the current climate it's difficult to schedule meat cutting too, another outlet for an already bottlenecked process is needed.

- We need 4-5 beef butchered yearly and currently I haul them to Jordan. That is almost 150 miles on way.
- We raise good beef, lamb, and game. Local interest and pride.
- would be a very big asset to our community Adding value to cull animals is needed and dollars made are often turned over multiple times within a small community
- Would create jobs and would be a convenience.
- Would use if properly staffed and operated.
